Understanding and Responding to Behaviour Policy

Objective: The primary objective of this policy is to create a safe, respectful, and productive learning environment for both tutors and students during one-on-one tutoring sessions held at the tutor's home, the child's school or any other venue.

Literacy Connections provides a safe physical and emotional environment for students and staff. We promote a culture of care and protection of students, and we prioritise this when managing behaviour and dealing with behaviour incidents.

At Literacy Connections we promote positive student behaviour and de-escalation of challenging behaviour. We accept that challenging behaviour may be a result of student unmet needs, and respond accordingly. For more information, see Reducing Student Distress.

Guidelines

At Literacy Connections all staff are made aware of the following guidelines for understanding and responding to behaviour:

- We make a clear statement on Behaviours that Enhance Learning, and Behaviours that are not Conducive to Learning. This statement is known to all staff, parents/caregivers, and students as part of our LC _ Plan for Understanding and Responding to Behaviour_Nov 2023*
- Tutors maintain positive learning environments and relationships with students and their whānau.
- We consistently apply our dysregulation management strategies in all cases of dysregulated behaviour, and try to maintain the mana of the student at all times.
- Tutors manage dysregulated behaviour appropriately and use de-escalation techniques if a student's behaviour poses a danger to themselves or others.
 Physical restraint may only be used by tutors to prevent imminent harm, and only according to our physical restraint guidelines.
- We work with parents/caregivers and schools if appropriate to use recognised successful strategies that help meet their needs.
- Parents/caregivers will stay for the duration of the tutoring session unless an alternative arrangement is agreed on through Literacy Connections. If a parent caregiver is not present please see the additional safety protocols under Tutor's Code of Conduct.
